



IMPACT Action Plan

Top 5 Learner Actions to Address Clinical Trial Enrollment and Treatment

- Discuss clinical trial options at the initial visit
- Ensure ancillary services, such as those provided by social workers, are involved early to determine any barriers to enrollment
- Use local navigators/cancer registries to acknowledge the need for more clinical trials in our area
- Build a stronger relationship with patients to earn trust through open communication
- Refer patients to advocacy groups like LLS and IMF* for more information

Top 5 Learner Actions to Reduce Health Disparities

- Share data with Black patients to show health outcomes are the same with equitable access to care
- Seek support to overcome barriers to access novel agents and ASCT
- Check each patient's chart to ensure transplant referrals have been considered and discussed
- Be more cognizant of racial disparities with myeloma patients
- Assess comorbidities that can influence patient outcomes
